This database lists all English and Welsh settlements that at some point between c. 1500 to c. 1900 either have been considered to be a town by historians, or, might be deemed urban on one or other of the urban definitions used by historians. It is based on 25 primary and secondary sources that list towns, markets, or population size between 1563 and 1911. The full records of these data are in a separate access data base. The database allows users to apply their preferred definition of a town to select records from the full list of candidate towns.

The data is summarized in a file alltownsdict.xlsx. Settlement names are listed as rows. The name of each column is an abbreviated title of a primary or secondary source. The appendix lists the full titles of the primary and secondary sources. Every time a candidate town occurs in a source it is indicated by "yes" in the appropriate field in the matrix column for each text.

The broad ranging nature of the database means that the candidate towns range from large cities like London, Norwich and Manchester (in the ninenteenth century) to a substantial number of very marginal seventeenth century market centres. The creation of this dataset was generously funded by grants from the NSF Modelling the Transport Revolution and the Industrial Revolution in England (SES-1260699) and the Leverhulme Trust Transport and Urbanization c.1670-1911 (RPG2013-093).

A number of individuals contributed to the work. Leigh Shaw-Taylor conceived the idea for and the initial database structure. Primary and secondary sources were selected by Leigh Shaw-Taylor, Tony Wrigley, Dan Bogart and Max Satchell. The database was first created by Mischa Davenport under the supervision of Leigh Shaw-Taylor who also supervised extensions by Aurianne Turki-Mignot. Gill Newton comprehensively overhauled the database and systematised its GIS linkages. Town/market lists were digitized by Dan Bogart, Mischa Davenport, Aurianne Turki-Mignot, and Annette McKenzie. Sebastiaan Keibek and Alan Rosevear identified errors and Alan Rosevear corrected those which were for towns in 17th century sources.
