Gentle Reminders

This means this assessment is **effectively out of 60 points, even though there are more than 60 points possible**. So, if you earn 60 points of the 68 possible, you'll actually get $60+8 = 68$ out of $68 = 100\%$ on the assessment. (Therefore, it's **possible to earn more than 100% on this assessment**: if you score 68 on the assessment, you'll actually get $68+8 = 76$ out of $68 = 112\%$.)

Format and aids

Format: Multiple choice true/false “explanations” after a statement

Example format:

Four is an odd number.

(a) True: Three is also an odd number

(b) True: But five isn't an odd number.

(c) False: Four is an even number.

(d) False: Four isn't a number at all. However, three is a number.
